Focusing on interdisciplinary projects

Some definitions

Cross-disciplinary: relating to or involving two or more disciplines (Meriam-Webster); viewing one discipline from the perspective of another. (X)

Multidisciplinary: people from different disciplines working together, each drawing on their disciplinary knowledge.

Interdisciplinary: involving two or more academic, scientific, or artistic disciplines (Meriam-Webster); integrating knowledge and methods from different disciplines, using a real synthesis of approaches. It involves the combining of two or more academic disciplines into one activity. It is about <u>creating</u> something by thinking across boundaries.

Through cooperation, any subject combination is feasible in eTwinning!





Steps towards effective collaborative interdisciplinary work

- 1. Get to know our colleagues
- 2. Build eTwinning team at school
- 3. Discuss within the project team
- 4. Collaborate within the team
- 5. Involve the students
- 6. Manage the project
- 7. Evaluate
- 8. Make our work public and visible





Step 1: Get to know our colleagues

- Devote time
- 2. Show genuine interest
- 3. Brush upon our communication skills
- 4. Never underestimate the power of chit-chatting

Step 2: Build the school's eTwinning team

- Define our aim (e.g. recruit colleagues of different subjects to create interdisciplinary projects)
- Present our vision
- "Power-responsibility equilibrium"
- Start small & be innovative (e.g. form eTwinning Clubs)

13 registered active eTwinners

7 registered eTwinners- activeTeachers (inactive on the TwinSpace)

2 registered inactive eTwinners

1 invisible eTwinner

1 non-eTwinner





Problems & how to tackle them

- lack of FL skills
- 2. lack of ICT skills
- 3. lack of time
- "I have a specific syllabus to teach. I can't waste class time working on eTwinning projects"

- Students, FL teachers take the lead
- 2. Students, ICT teachers take the lead
- 3. time management
- 4. teach the syllabus through eTwinning



Give the floor to all team members

Encourage new ideas

Show excitement

Avoid long meetings

Step 4: Collaborate within the project team

work as a team and share experiences, practices and resources

- to plan pedagogical activities, eTwinning projects & actions
- to work out the school's Action Plan, any project plan

work as a team and organise hand-on workshops and events

• to inspire each other and/or share knowledge and expertise


work as a team & organise eTwinning actions and Festivals

- for peer-teaching
- for dissemination





Collaborate for eTwinning Actions & Festivals





Step 5. Involve the students

- in decision-making for projects and actions
- in organising onsite events to present their projects
- in organising events to share their new knowledge acquired while working on a project

• in training teachers in digital technology







Step 6: Manage the project

- 1. Manage human resources
- 2. Schedule regular intervals to check on the project.
- 3. Be flexible.
- 4. Address any problems before they occur.
- 5. Manage time (timeline, deadlines)



Programming Edison with EdScratch

Having studied the material provided by our DVS partners, the 5th Graders of the 10th Helioupolis Primary School tried to program Edison with EdScratch working in different modes (in pairs, in groups, onsite, online). Here's a report of their effort.

Task

Create your own program with Edscratch online so that Edison Robot will move forward for two (2) seconds with speed eight (8) and then turn right for one (1) second with speed two (2).

 If you have an Edison Robot make a video while running the code and upload it in the padlet.

If you don't have an Edison Robot upload on the padlet a photo of your code and we will make a video in which the Edison Robot will run your code

Step 7: Evaluate

Ongoing and Final Evaluation and Feedback ensures improvement & eventually better results

- invite colleagues, partners, students, parents, to participate in the evaluation
- recognise key strengths
- recognise points of improvement





Step 8: Make project work public and visible

- Organise online events on eTwinning Live
- Organise onsite events with the kids starring (performances, festivals, exhibitions)
- Promote the events through social media
- Disseminate the project results at conferences, workshops, the school, local and/or national websites (Abide with the General Data Protection Regulation)
- Feed the results into new projects
